




- Predynastic Mesopotamian city states and Empire (7000BC to 539BC):

- Earliest evidence of iron use is approximately 1800 BC in central





- Language rules are recorded for Classical Sanskrit in Panini's Grammar
- Alexander the Great reaches India
- Emperor Ashoka promotes the spread of Buddhism to Sri Lanka
- Gautam Buddha, founder of Buddhism (563BC to 483BC)
- Mahavir, founder of Jainism (599BC to 527BC)

- Old Persian Empire: Archaemenid (550BC to 330BC)
- Ancient Greece: Archaic and Classical Period (800BC to 323BC) Death of Alexander the Great marked the end of the Classical Period
- Maya Civilization: Pre-classic Age (1000BC to 250AD)







- ♦ Kanishka
- Diplomatic contact with contemporary kingdoms, official languages of the Kushan Empire were Greek, Bactrian and Sanskrit
- Satvahans (100BC to 200AD)
- ♦ Early Chola (300BC to 200AD)
- Early Chera (4th Century BC to 5th Century AD)
- Golden Age: The Gupta Empire and Dynasty (320AD to 550AD)
 - ⋄ Trade, commerce and art expand
 - Science, math and poetry develop: Kalidas wrote Shakuntala
 - Number system developed by Aryabhat, the number zero developed by Brahmagupta

- Sassanid Dynasty in Persia (200AD to 650AD)
- Birth of Christ
- Roman Empire (100BC to 400AD) which split into the
 - Western Roman Empire (285AD to 476AD) and the
 - Eastern Roman (Byzantine) Empire (330AD to 1453AD)
